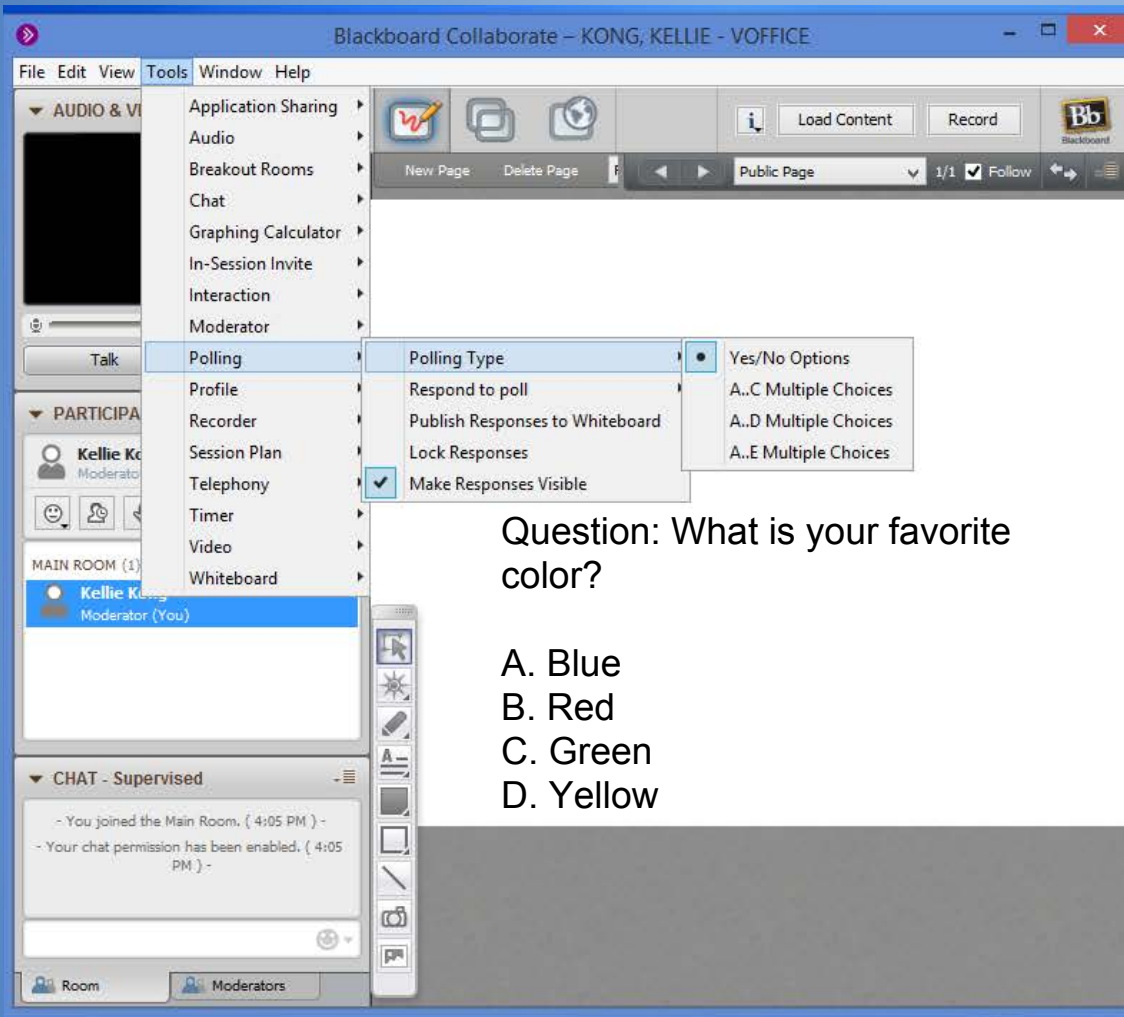

- Publish poll results

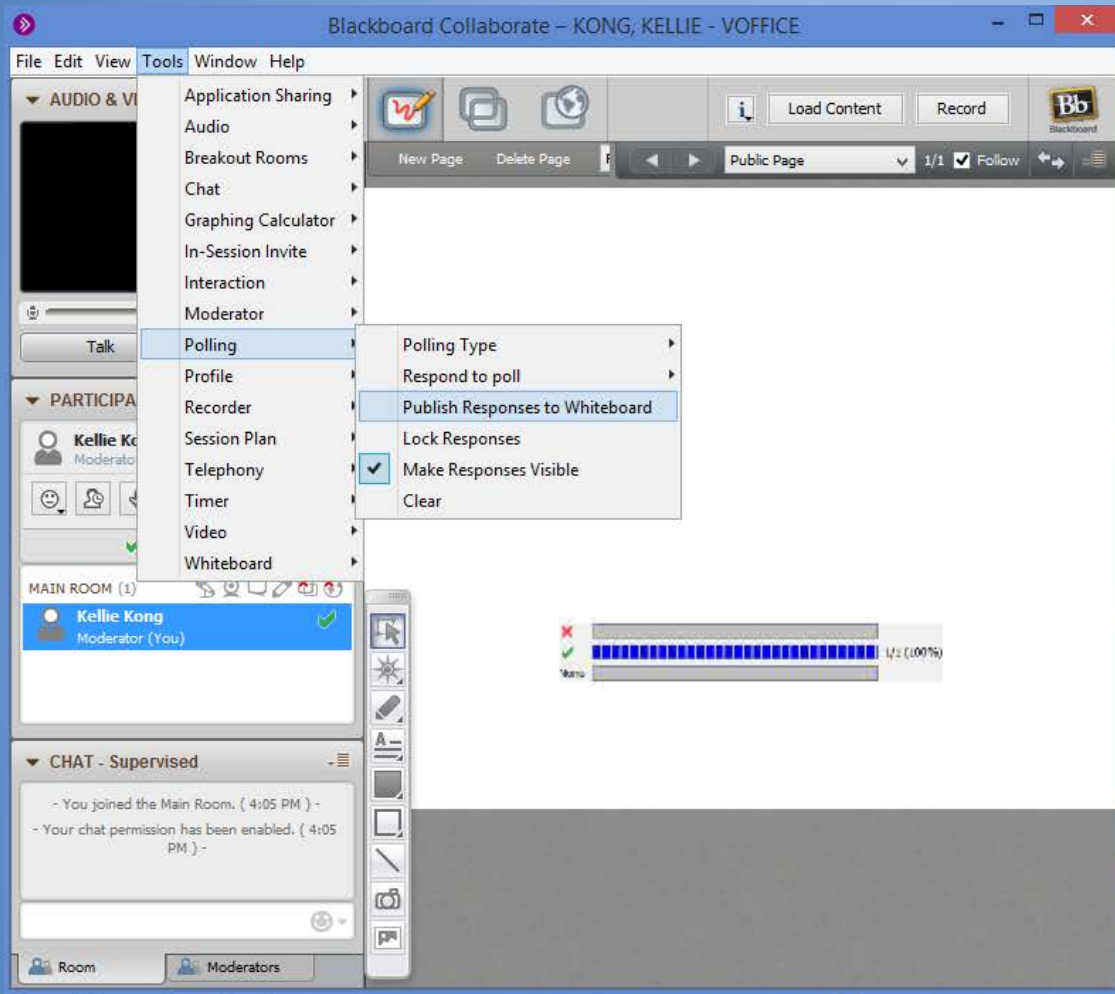


Change Poll Type

Publish Poll

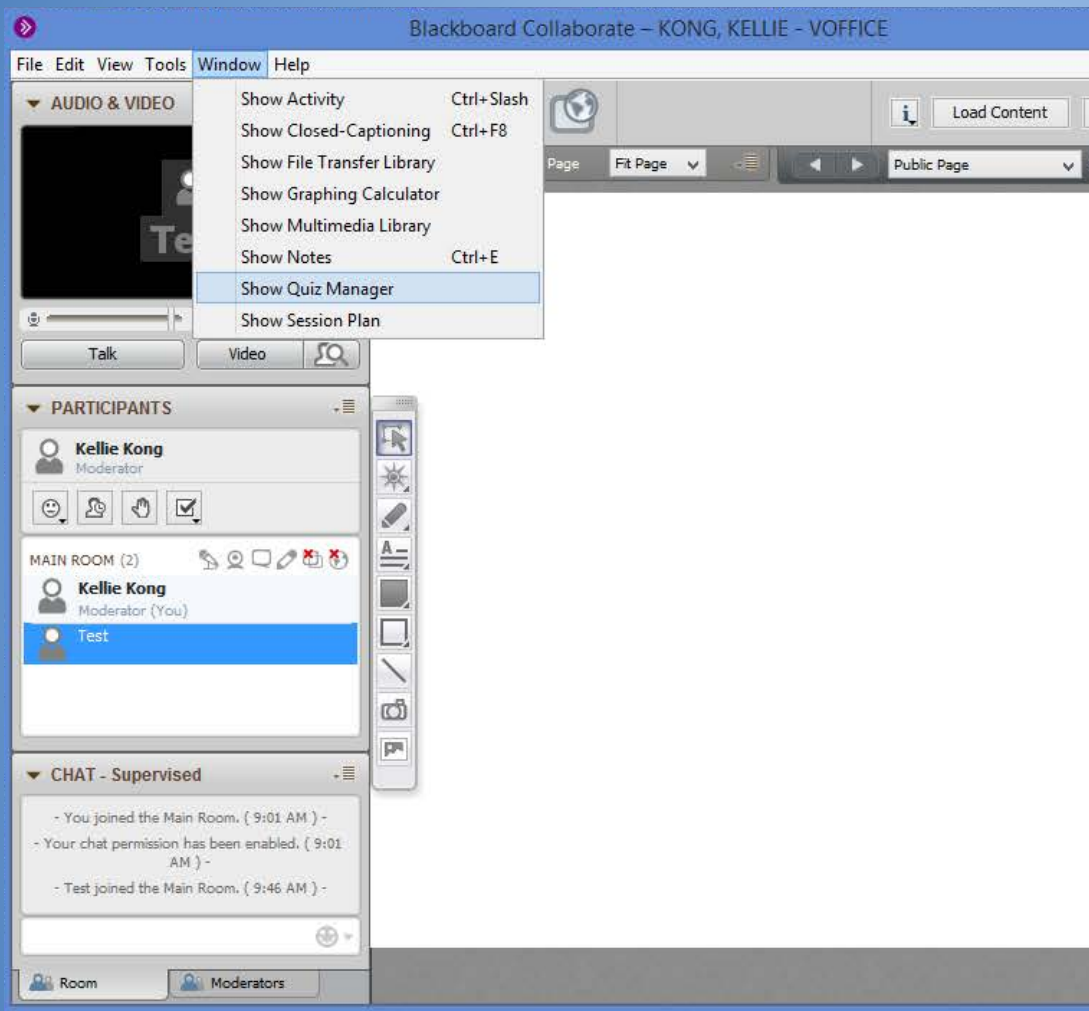
- Go to Tools - Polling - Publish Responses to Whiteboard

The published results will not update with new responses

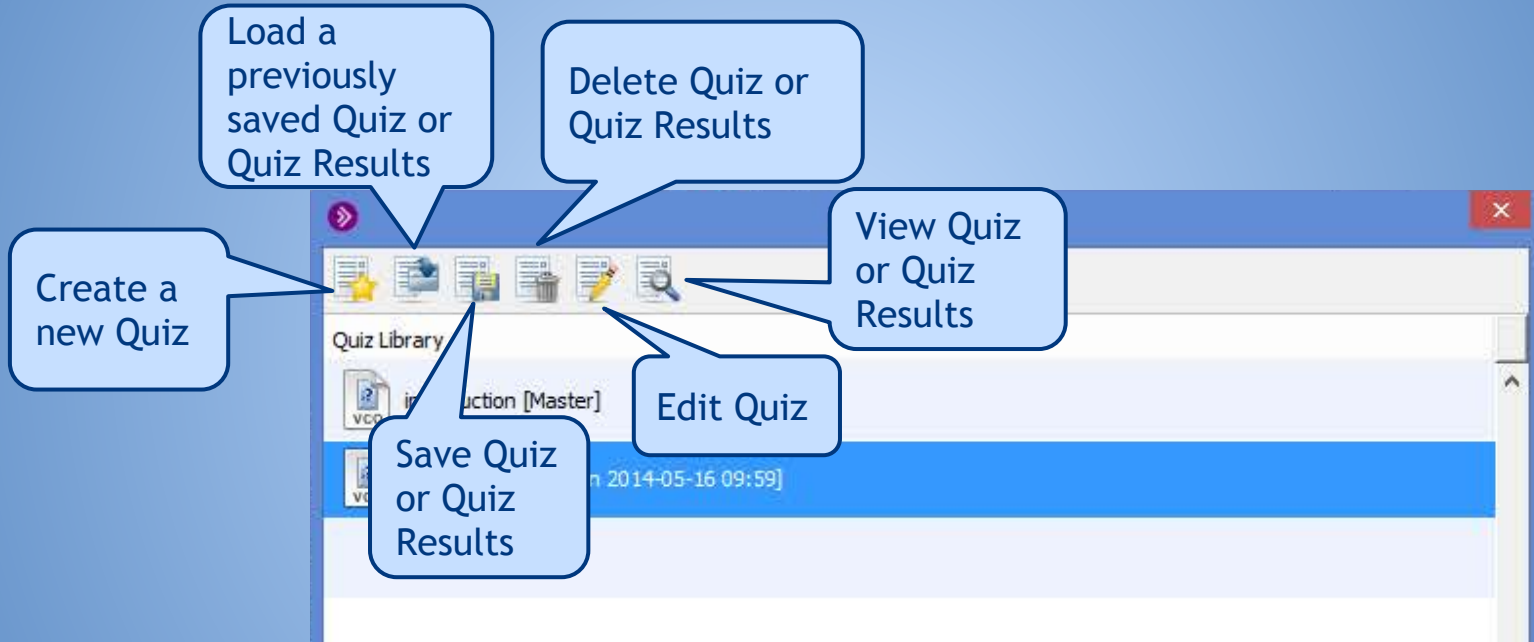

- Save quiz results



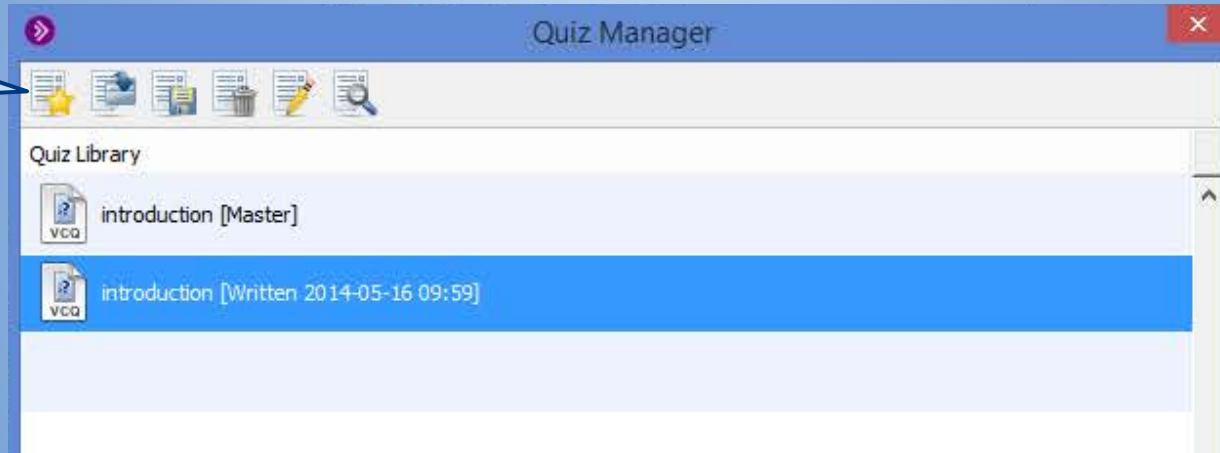
- ## Open Quiz Manager

The Quiz Manager will clear all quizzes and results and the end of a Blackboard Session.



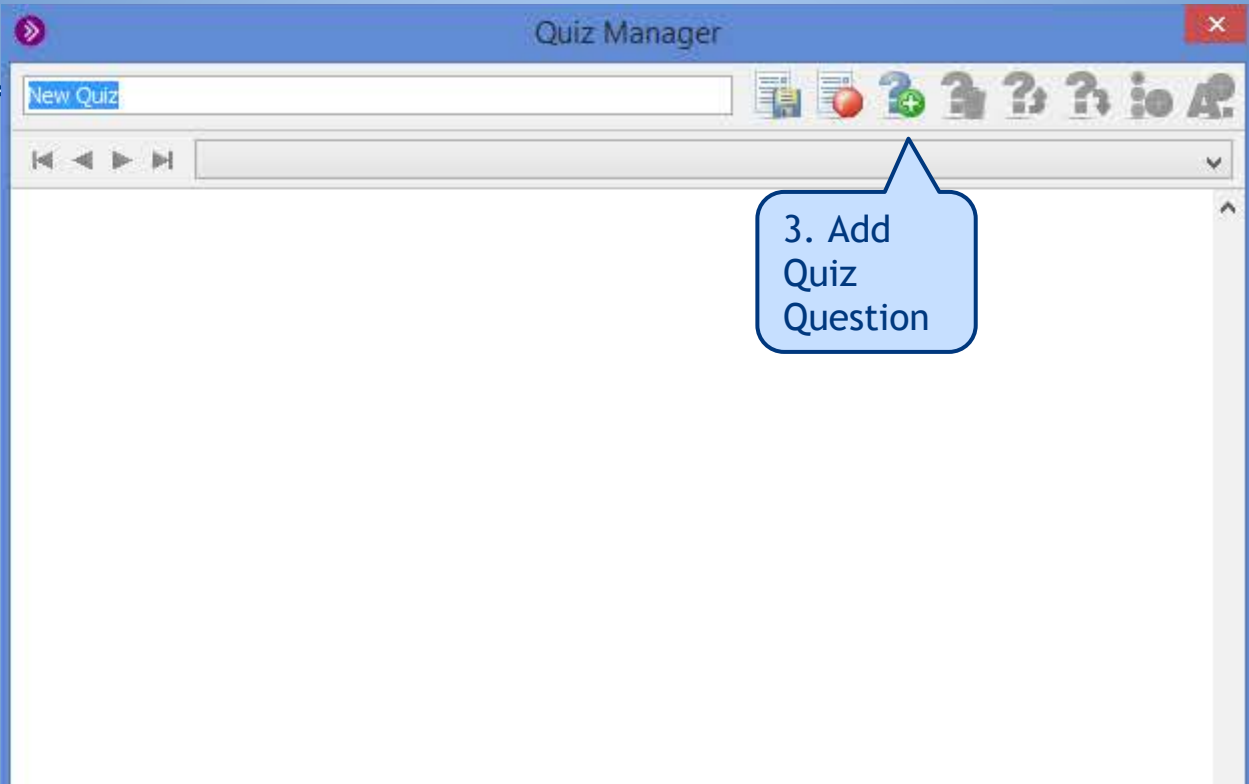

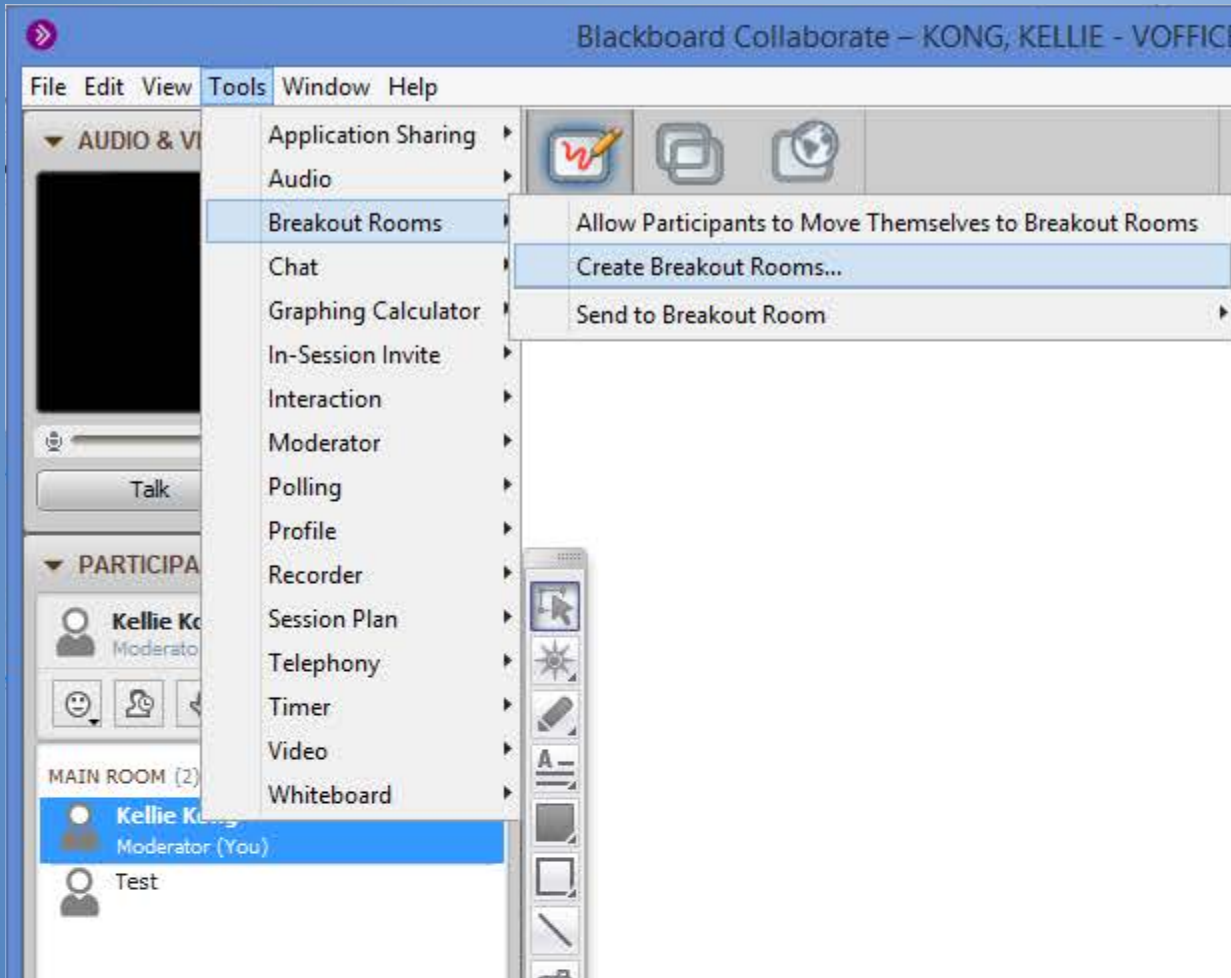

Breakout Rooms


- Small group discussions

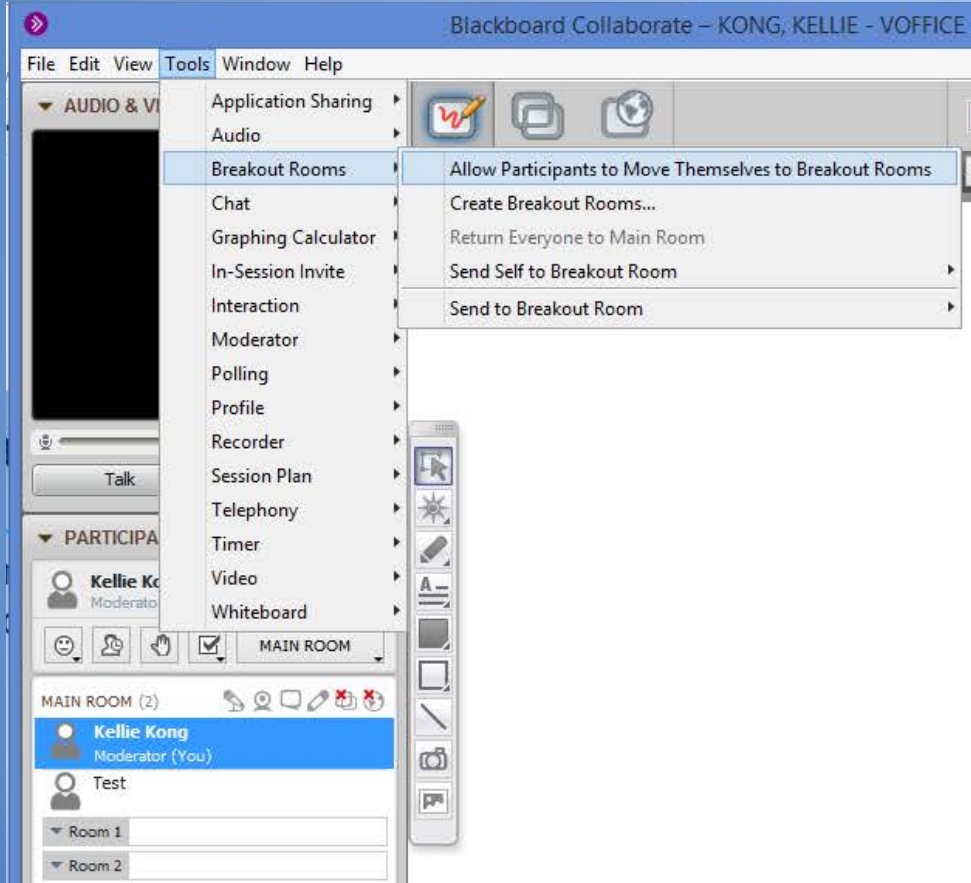

Create Breakout Rooms

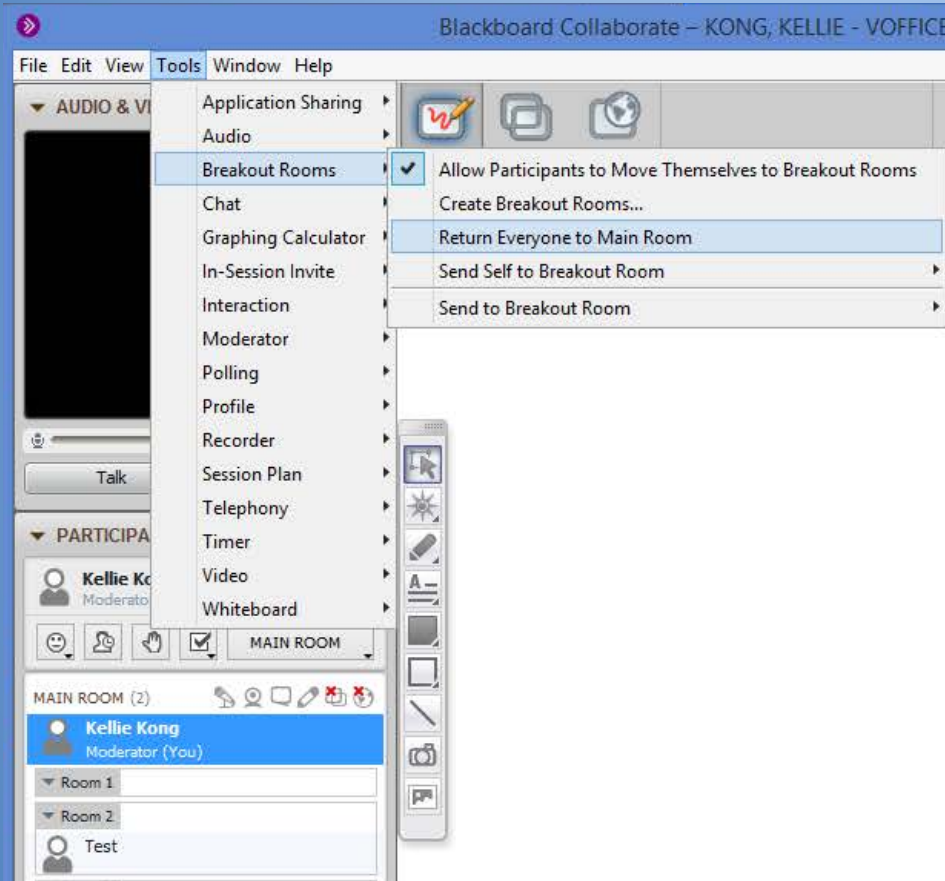


Students may also move themselves to breakout rooms, by dragging and dropping

Note: Students using the mobile version of Blackboard Collaborate, are unable to do this, and the instructor will need to move them

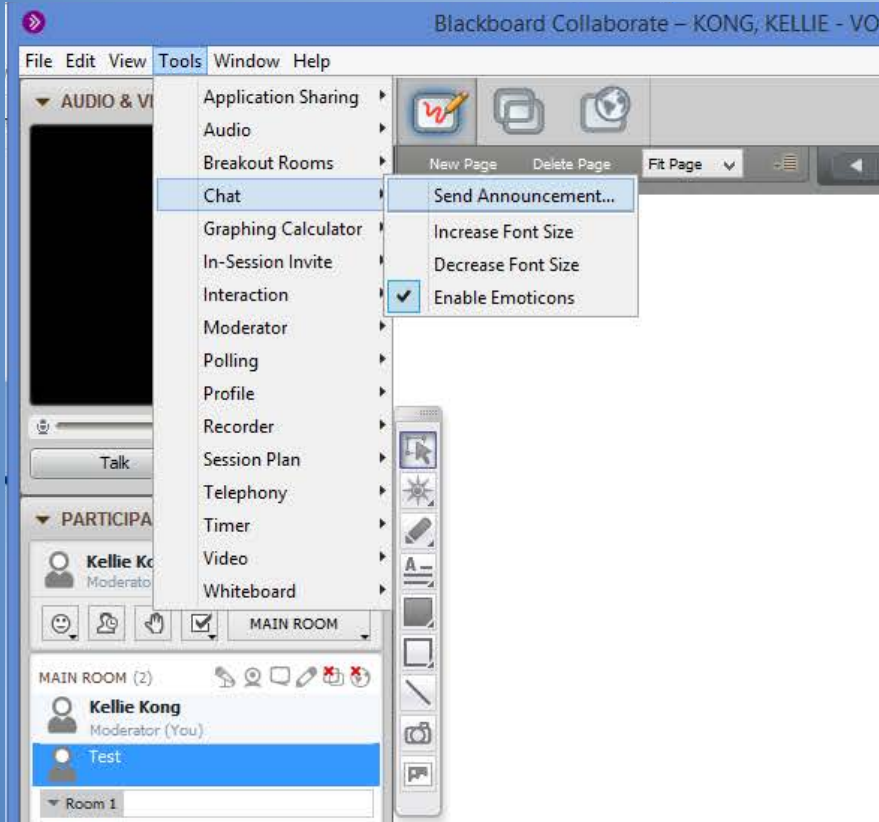
Return from Breakout Rooms



You can recall all participants to the main room


- Tools - Breakout Rooms - Return Everyone to Main Room
- If enabled, students can drag and drop themselves to the main room

Chat Announcements



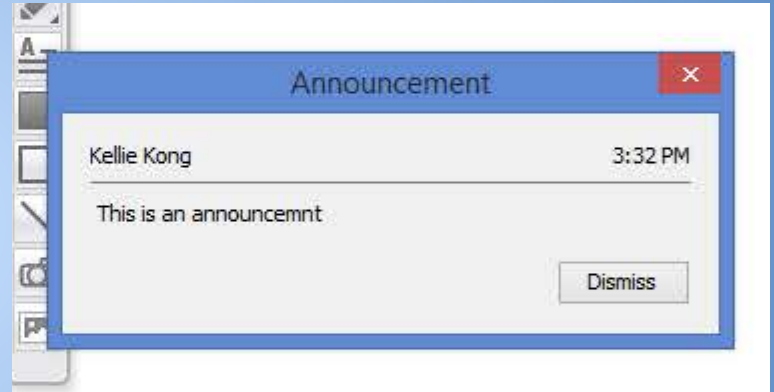
- Send out announcements across all chat rooms, including breakout rooms
- Useful to remind students of instructions, or how much time is left

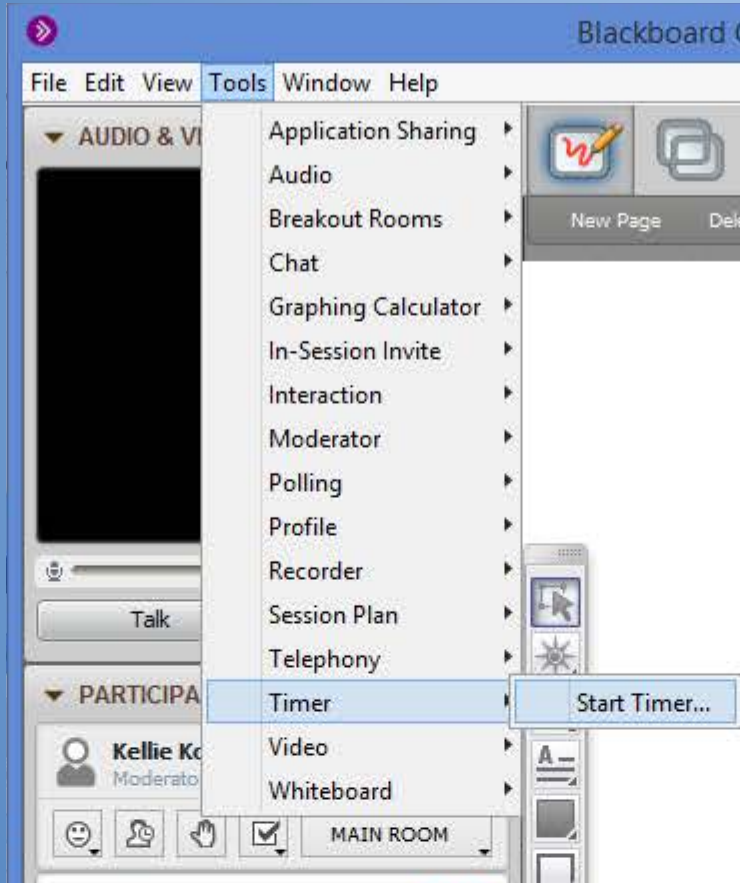

Multimedia Library

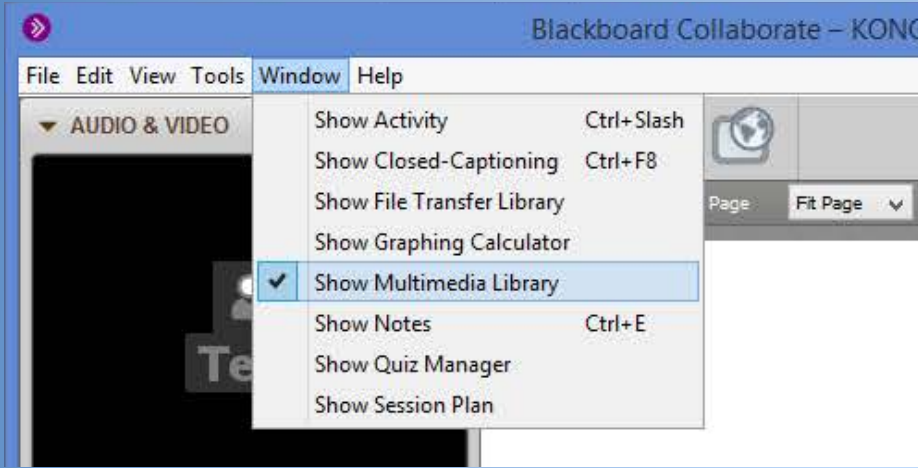
- Upload videos and audio files for participants to view in Blackboard
 - Accepted file types (.swf, .mpg, .mov, .m4v, .mp4, .mww, .mp3)
 - Upload from a file
 - Upload from a url (url must end in a multimedia extension, ex. <http://www.hawaii.edu/video.mp4>)

Multimedia Library


- While it is convenient to stay centrally in one location, it is time and bandwidth intensive
 - File is loaded to BBC
 - File is loaded on to the participants' device

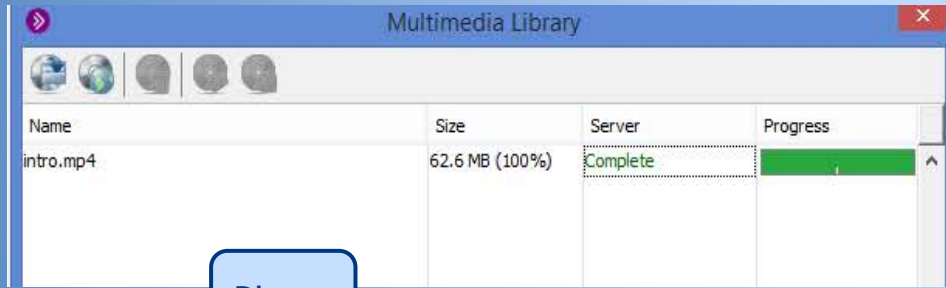

This is the error you will receive if you try to play the file before all participants of have loaded the video

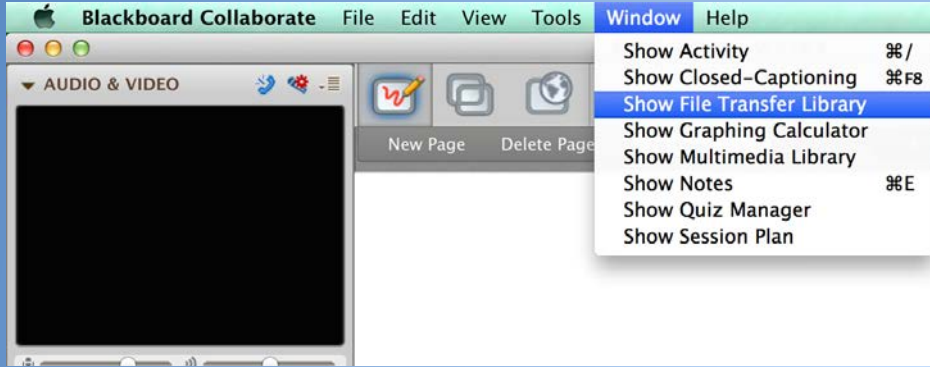


Note: This is what it looks like when it's completed. You can select the multimedia then, play or stop the media file. Instructors do not have the ability to advance the multimedia across all participants' platforms, as participants maintain control over the multimedia's playback.

- Useful tool to share resources during a BBC Session
- Participants can be notified

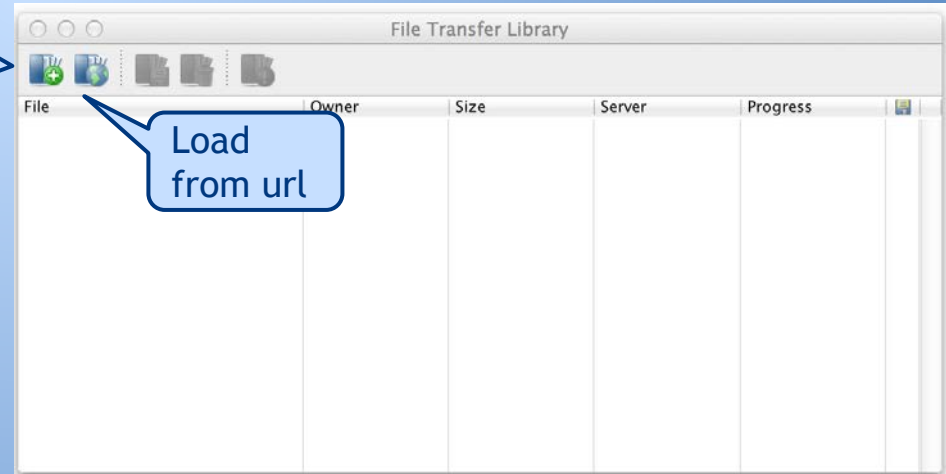



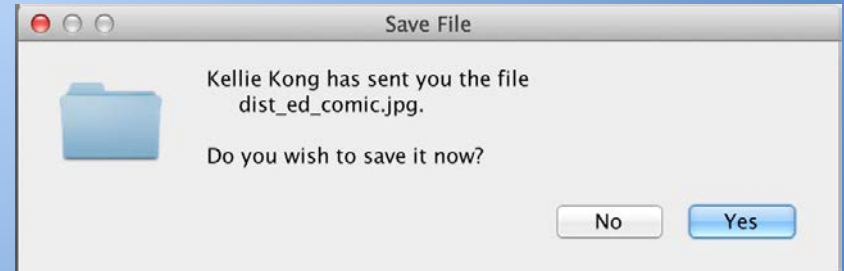

Saving your session

- Available for download
 - Participant List (saves as a .txt)
 - Whiteboard (saves as a .pdf or .png)
 - Chat (saves as a .txt)
 - Quiz (.vcq)
- Saved files can be loaded in later sessions

BBC Publish

- Publish your recorded session as an audio or video file
- Available on PC and Mac
- BBC Publish Download
 - Note: Program may be installed as “Elluminate Publish!”

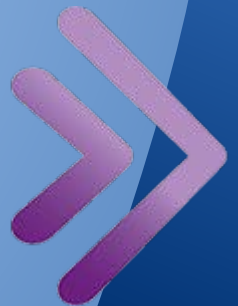

- Send out videos and websites for participants to review prior to the BBC Session
- Participants will be removed for a BBC Session if viewing a website after 5 minutes

What is Java?

- Java is a software that is used for a variety of things such as online games, instant messaging, online banking, and Blackboard Collaborate
- Java is NOT the same as Javascript, which is a coding language used to build websites



Java Updates

- Java updates frequently to keep your system secure
- Java updates are typically automatic
- Checking to see if Java is up to date, is the first step in troubleshooting
 - <http://www.java.com/en/download/installed.jsp>



Clearing your Java Cache

- Clearing the cache will force your web browser to reload the current version of a web page
- Light BBC users should clear their cache once per month
- Heavy BBC users should clear their cache once a week

Wireless Mic & BBC

- Option 1 - Wireless USB Microphone
- Option 2 - USB microphone with long cable
- Option 3 - Bluetooth Speakerphone
- Option 4 - Bluetooth Headset (cellphone)

Video Options & BBC

- Webcam
 - Built in on laptops
 - USB
 - Microsoft Surface 2 Pro
- Student volunteer or TA



BBC's White Board

- Load presentations directly from PowerPoint
 - Presentations become flat - all transitions and animations are removed
- Create multiple pages
 - Preload poll questions on different pages for easy access
- Load images (.png, .jpg, .bmp, .gif)

BBC Best Practices

- Limit the amount of web cameras used
 - High amounts of data - slower speeds
- Screen sharing and web tours also use lots of bandwidth
 - Give user the url, and ask them to follow you on their own while you narrate
