



# How to Upload/Download Multiple Resources to Laulima (Cyberduck Program Windows 7/8, Mac OS 10.6 and above)

This tutorial will show you how to:

- How to use Cyberduck to access the **WebDAV** connection in Laulima
  - Cyberduck can save a lot of time and energy 😊

WebDAVs allow you to **easily click and drag files** from your computer and place them into Laulima. By doing so, the files are then readily available for your students to reference. WebDAVs are **more efficient** than uploading a single resource at a time using a web browser.

WebDAVs **require an internet connection** to work, so make sure you are connected before starting.



Please download and install [Cyberduck](#) prior to beginning this tutorial.

**Step 1:** Log in to Laulima and click on the **tab** to the course that you would like to set up the WebDAV for.

**Step 2a:** Click on the **Resources** tab **on the left**.

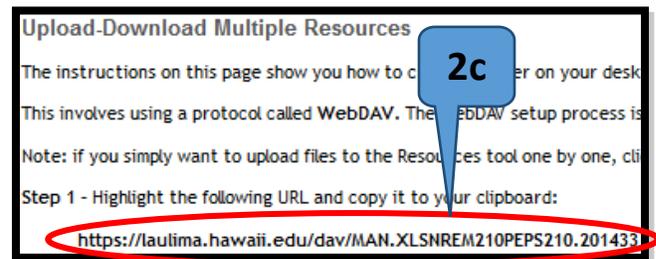


Upload/Download Multiple Resources link.

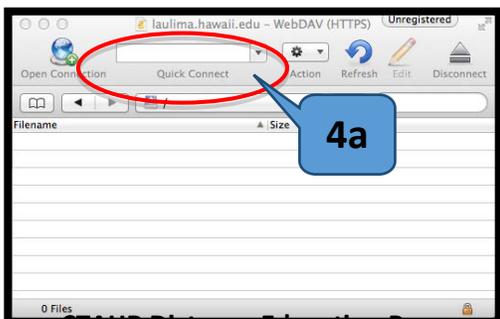
**Step 2c:** You should see a bolded URL. **Select the URL** and then **copy** it by holding down CTRL+C,

Command+C or ⌘+C.

**Step 2b:** **At the top**, click on



**Step 3: Open Cyberduck.** The Cyberduck icon is shown to the left, and can be accessed by using the Start button (PC) or the dock (Mac)

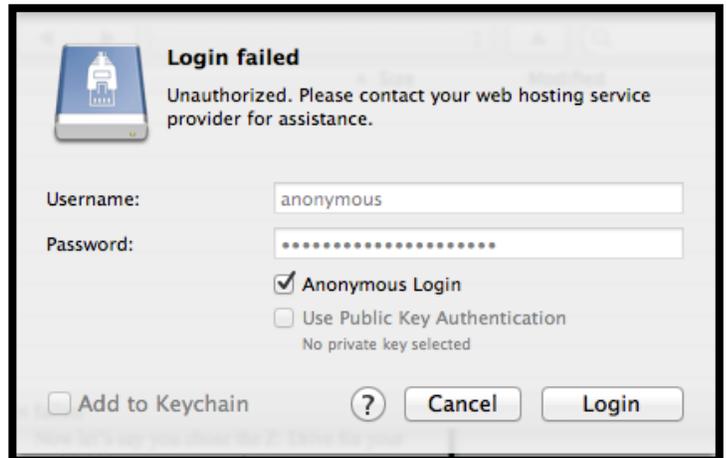


**Step 4:** In the "Quick Connect" field, paste the URL that you got from the Laulima Resources Page, then hit "return" on your keyboard. When prompted for your Username and Password, use your Laulima information to log in.

**Step 5:** If you see the pop up screen [to the right](#), uncheck “Anonymous Login” and proceed to fill out the Username and Password with your Laulima information. Click “Login” when done.

**Note:** For security reasons, you may want to keep “Add to Keychain” unchecked, unless this is your personal computer.

Once you log through Cyberduck, you will be able to see everything that is in your Laulima Resources folder for your course, except it’s in Cyberduck instead of your web browser. Simply click and drag your files to move them, like you normally would, into Cyberduck to add them to Laulima.
